For God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control. (2 Timothy 1:7)

Do not quench the Spirit (1 Thessalonians 5:19)

In Ephesians 6:13, Paul instructs us to "the whole armour of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm." Satan will do everything within his power to stop us and discourage us in our work for the Lord. He is wanting us to loose and abandon confidence in our Almighty Father. Paul is illustrating our firm foundation in Christ; we need to stand fast to the truths we have learned and living righteously.

We must be active in doing our part in furthering God's kingdom on earth and the gospel. We must never loose sight of our eternal life as our goal, we should be using God's Word as the sword which cuts through the deception of the world.

Our capability to remain spiritually strong and active for the Gospel is dependant on how much we daily rely on God; and our line of communication for that help is through prayer. Paul encouraged Christians to pray not only for themselves but others: "Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving. At the same time, pray also for us, that God may open to us a door for the word, to declare the mystery of Christ, on account of which I am in prison." (Colossian 4:2-3)

One of the main keys to keeping the working of God's Spirit active and stirred up in our lives is keeping our minds on the big picture of what God is doing. If we dwell excessively on ourselves and our own problems we become far more vulnerable to Satan's negative influences. Paul urged all new converts to see themselves as part of a great work that God is doing. As the point man for the work of God in their region of the world, he encouraged them to enthusiastically support his efforts through their prayers.

James tells us, "Draw near to God and He will draw near to you" (James 4:8).
